(These have changed significantly under Provisions of the 2022 Constitution, and allow Proxy Voting we have used in the past, whereas the Model Constitution, referred to in previous Notices of AGM, precludes that form of voting)

Extract, 2022 RFPA Constitution

Part 8(3) Voting -

- (a) On a question arising at any meeting of the Association, each Member has one personal vote only and additionally by proxy but no such Member may hold more than five proxies.
- (b) A Member is not entitled to vote at any meeting of the Association unless all money due and payable by the Member has been paid.

Part 8(4) Appointment of proxies -

(a) Each Member entitled to a personal vote under clause 8.3 is entitled to appoint another such Member as their proxy by written notice given to the Secretary no later than 24 hours before the meeting commences in respect of which the proxy is appointed.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Another business year has passed and how our focus has been adjusted, following the analysis done by **Dave Whiteman**, one of the most dedicated workers we have. The feeling of 'steady as she goes' has given way to 'what can we do to promote and make the RFPA relevant into the future?'

We had some issues with the email arrangements becoming unreliable through service providers, professional filters and networks making them less and less accessible to the Membership.

As a result, we abandoned our older email addresses and adopted our domain-based system which uses our website as the basis for electronic communication. This has also allowed us to bypass (quite ethically and necessarily) the decision by NSWPF to disallow direct email contact with some public mail servers.

Our Membership database had become cumbersome through a natural decade or more of commercial development in the information technology sphere. Dave determined, through his up-to-date and extensive work in one of his day jobs, that we needed an industry standard and regularly upgradable database which could be interrogated for real time information and trends. Presto! Now we don't have to estimate too many things, and know where we stand. The CoM and Branch Secretaries have the latest information and can act on it.

Then, on **Dave's** analysis, we took a long hard look at trends, which told us many things we probably suspected, but now had concrete evidence on which to base a business plan. The CoM is looking at income, expenditure, the relevance of every proposal put to us by the Membership or amongst the Committee themselves, dealing with compliance and governance issues as forecasts, and looking at every opportunity to advertise our Association through brand recognition strategies.

We are building a succession plan, as we have also recognised our own vulnerability measured against age, and in some cases, against many years of weighing in as volunteer workers who understand our Members as well as any group of a dozen or so former police could do.

With all that in mind, we have allowed Dave to resign from the CoM and focus on his job as the Webmaster, Facebook manager and database trouble-shooter and developer, and we thank him immensely for his past ongoing work. Good luck Dave with the Chairman's job at Northern Beaches Branch, which, of course, runs like clockwork.

The CoM has used data analysis and group thinking to move in a number of relevant areas:

- The Membership fee structure has been modified and should serve us well into the future. Members will note that their fees (in many cases due this month if you don't have a deduction or periodical payment in place to credit 815000 70483) have not increased. The general fee remains at \$28, unless you are already contributing to paperless (deductions which we don't have to process manually) or previously allowed concessions. Those who already are exempt from paying fees will remain so. The unfortunate news is that when you attain 'OBE' status, being 80 years of age no longer entitles you to free Membership. We currently forego \$31,192-00 pa in allowing this exemption, with 1,114 Veterans on the books. If this decision causes any hardship, please call the Secretary and the information will be considered by CoM.
- The categories of RFPA Membership are reduced to two (Member or Associate) with several levels withing those categories (Veteran, Life, Honorary etc). Members are those with a former NSWPF registered number, and Associates are anyone else who is accepted into the Membership. Veterans are over 80 years of age, Life Memberships are created under the Constitution in respect of their service rendered, and Honorary Members are either ex-officio, as the Commissioner, our Chaplains and sponsors who make significant contributions to the RFPA.
- The processes used in reporting 'Vale' information are subject to business rules, which will allow formal processes between bereaved parties, Police protocol, the Secretary, local police commands, our provider of service sashes and the CoM to provide accurate information through the website where former colleagues, family members, VIP'S and RFPA friends and Associates can be respectfully acknowledged after their passing, and in most cases, before funerals or memorials are held.

- The succession plan looks specifically for potential CoM Members to assist at first, and then if elected, to take various roles within the CoM. This is serious business, but suits some Members who seek to contribute and provide the Friendship, Fellowship and Welfare strands of our core business, either directly or indirectly. If you or anyone you know fits this bill, and can give one regular day per month and the occasional additional commitment for a special event, this is for you.
- Our Brand recognition strategy seeks to identify the RFPA as a standalone organisation representing former police in the socialising sphere, and with the ability to refer those in distress to welfare arrangements. We currently have 4,151 Members who are able to take part in what the RFPA arranges, mostly in the 25 active Branches across NSW and QLD. Some of those who contact us through the website contact forms are of the belief that they are Members, when they have not made an application for membership. They are regularly referred to the 'forms' menu, and most then join us.
- To further promote our RFPA 'brand', we have requested that the RFPA
 be permitted to provide and academic prize or similar, along with a
 short public speech, to those graduating from various courses
 (including recruits) at the Goulburn Academy. We also hope to fly
 an RFPA flag in an appropriate location at Goulburn and possibly other
 locations.
- The question of sponsorship is being explored with Police Bank executives. This may take the form of advertising within our Gazette, providing an agreement can be reached without damaging our current sponsorship arrangements with the Bank. Please note that the Bank already sponsors the RFPA in respect of the printing of our Gazette, and that they also sponsor the AFP and Tasmania Police retired and former associations, as well as mental health provider Emerge and See, amongst others

For those patiently waiting, your Secretary is currently undergoing training to use the new RFPA Membership card printer. Newer Members and Veterans should receive a card in the mail before too long.



MACARTHUR RFPA CHARITY GOLF DAY



In January 2023 we formulated a plan to purchase Defibrillators for the Local Police Commands at Campbelltown and Narellan. We investigated the opportunity to organise a Charity Golf Day to raise the necessary funds which at this stage were to purchase 3 Defibrillators (\$6000 +). We booked the 1st June at the Lakeside Golf Club, Gledswood Hills to make the day happen.

We made personal contact with Senior Officers at Campbelltown and Narellan Police Commands and received their positive

acknowledgement of our desires. We continued with our endeavours and as a result our Sponsorship and Donations to the cause continued to grow with an impressive list of local Businesses prepared to join and ensure our success.

The number one feedback reason from all the Sponsors that we contacted to participate in this project was that they already thought that Police Vehicles were fitted with Defibrillators. Consequently, this did assist in reaching our final, conclusion.

To encapsulate the event, we maximised the Teams to 10 with 4 Players per team and a Fee of \$600.00 per team to participate. Included in that fee were 18 holes of golf with an electric Cart to traverse the Course, a Breakfast consisting of a Bacon and Egg Roll for starters and concluded with a main luncheon and Presentation to the Winners.



To benefit the Sponsors, we had all 18 holes displaying their individual Logos and an Appreciation Board with their Logos garnered for more visibility in acknowledgement of their Sponsorship. This Board will be used when the official presentations to the 3 Police Commands are completed.



On the day of the event even the weather was a sponsor with a fine sunny day delivered for all participants to enjoy their golf.
