PRESIDENT'S REPORT

On Saturday 30 August by invitation I attended the Formal Dining Night of 1 MP Battalion & The City of Blacktown RSL Sub-Branch in the Ball Room of Blacktown Workers Club. Another enjoyable evening where I mixed and spoke with both Former & Serving Police who also have Military background.

The 4 September was Retired Police Day and I along with 30+ Retired Police attended Castle Hill RSL at the invitation of Castle Hill Command. This was a joint event involving Castle Hill, Riverstone and Parramatta Police Commands.

On Monday 15 September I attended the **Woronora Cemetery Police Wall of Remembrance Service**. There are 24 fallen Police Officer and 2 Colonial Troopers interred within those grounds. As usual it was well organized and there were about 150 in attendance made up of Senior Police, Politicians, Family Members of those interred and members of the public. I laid a Wreath on behalf of the Retired & Former Police Assn.

On Friday 26 September along with **George Weissel, Paul Smith and Gary Raymond** I attended the Eastern Suburbs Memorial Park to participate in the Police Memorial Service at the Wall of Remembrance situated at that location.

There are 31 Fallen NSW Police and 4 Colonial Troopers interred in the grounds of the Memorial Park.

Each year at this Ceremony whilst remembering all those whose names are on the Wall we especially remember one or two individuals. This year those persons were **Constable 1st Class Wayne Allen Rixon and Probationary Constable Themitis (Tim) Arthur Macarounas**.

The Ceremony was well attended by Senior Police, Politicians, Family Members and many local Community Members. The Police Band Quartet, the Mounted Police, Local HWP and serving Police were also in attendance. The Police Association was represented as was the Police Bank.

A moving Service was conducted and Acting Asst Commissioner **Despa Fitzgerald APM** read the tributes relating to Constable I/C **Rixon and P/Const Macarounas**.

A special mention must be made to C/Insp **Tracey Ford** who is also on our Organising Committee and she gives so much in ensuring the Ceremony is a success each year.

On Monday 29 September I attended and participated in the Police Memorial Service in Sydney Domain. Snr Vice President **George Weissel** and Committee

member **Paul Smith APM** along with 10 members of Parramatta the Hills Branch were also in attendance.

After the Ceremony Commissioner **Mal Lanyon APM** pulled me aside and spoke on having a meeting with him in the near future.

On Friday 17 October I met with **John Carroll** from Macarthur Branch at Narellan to deliver an Award Shield for **Roger Ford**. We spoke on a number of matters including the Department's decision to remove Defibrillators from Police vehicles. Their Branch had raised significant funds and had provided these Life Saving Devices for Police vehicles in their area. Likewise the Parramatta – The Hills Branch had raised funds and provided 2 Defibrillators for Police vehicles at Blacktown. The Macarthur Branch has raised this matter with their Local Member.

On Friday 31 by invitation of the Commissioner I attended a Memorial Service at the Sydney Police Centre.

RESTORATION OF A GRAVE.

And over the last 12 months a great deal of work has been carried out, including research about the **Henry Kelly** grave site. Gosford RSL Sub-Branch was involved financially in the venture and special thanks should be directed to that unit. **Former Senior Constable Mick Oates** carried out extensive research which resulted in finding current relatives of **Henry Kelly**.

On Wednesday, 24th September, 2025, a large group of senior Police and other dignitaries, including **Police Minister Yasmin Catley, and our Father Jim**, attended the official unveiling of the **Henry Kelly** grave site. And former **Senior Constable Mick Oates** delivered a eulogy dedicated to Henry Kelly. **Henry Kelly** served in the Boar War, which lasted from 1899 to 1902, in a Mounted Rifles unit, No. 1407. Following his return from that war he joined the NSW Police and his grave shows his registered Police number as 8121. He passed away on 19th April, 1919.

MEDAL PRESENTATION.

Chairman Geoff represented the Central Coast Branch of the RFPA, on 16th October, 2025, when he attended a medal presentation conducted at the Davistown RSL Club to which he had been invited.

NSW Police Force Dog Unit Visit – Menai

Our visit continued with a tour of the new kennels, used when handlers are on leave, and a moving remembrance wall honouring police dogs killed in the line of duty. The tour concluded with a demonstration of a black German Shepherd undergoing training with its handler.

He spoke of his own personal experiences having more than 20 years' service in the Water Police at various locations. He spoke of the large patrol area of his unit, which covers 70 nautical miles from the border to Yamba and extends to over 200 nautical miles east of Lord Howe Island. Collaboration with other services such as Queensland Water Police, Maritime Search and Rescue and the Royal Australian Navy and other Commonwealth agencies quite often takes place in coastal waters and international waters.

There were many and varied questions asked by members present in what was an absorbing and interesting discussion, covering such matters as drug importation, re-branding of stolen water craft and everything in between. Enjoyed by everyone. Thank you **Andrew** for wonderful presentation and your valuable time.
